



RABBIT IS RICH

UPDIKES PULITZER WINNING BOOKS

His most famous work is his "Rabbit" series (the novels <u>Rabbit</u>, <u>Run</u>; <u>Rabbit Redux</u>; <u>Rabbit Is</u> <u>Rich</u>; <u>Rabbit at Rest</u>; and the novella <u>Rabbit Remembered</u>), which chronicles the life of the middle-class everyman <u>Harry "Rabbit"</u> <u>Angstrom</u> over the course of several decades, from young adulthood to death. Both <u>Rabbit Is Rich</u> (1981) and <u>Rabbit at Rest</u> (1990) were awarded the <u>Pulitzer Prize</u>.

Describing his subject as "the American small town, <u>Protestant</u> middle class", critics recognized his careful craftsmanship, his unique prose style, and his prolific output – a book a year on average. Updike populated his fiction with characters who "frequently experience personal turmoil and must respond to crises relating to religion, family obligations, and marital infidelity".



JOHN UPDIKE

"He captured, and sometimes embodied, a generation's confusion over the civil rights and women's movements, and opposition to the Vietnam war. Updike was called a misogynist, a racist and an apologist for the establishment."

"He was prolific, even compulsive, publishing more than 50 books in a career that started in the 1950s. Updike won virtually every literary prize going; only the Nobel eluded him. To compensate, he awarded it to one of his fictional characters, Henry Bech, the womanising, egotistical novelist who featured in a number of his works.


